A CHRISTIAN HAS CONE TO HIS REWARD

On Saturday evening, about 7:30 PM, in Orlando, Florida, Brother Zadoc J. Piety passed from the walks of this life into the eternal care of our Father in heaven. He was seventy-nine years old. His funeral is scheduled for the day this paper is to be mailed.

The reason Brother Piety holds a special place with the church in South Bend is hecause it was he and his family in whose home the church first met back in 1923. Bro. Piety has ten living children, all of whom are members of the Lord's kingdom. Three of his daughters are members of the Donmoyer Avenue congregation: Sisters Clara Kelley. Mildred Moore, and Mary Campbell. Two other daughters are members at Caroline Street church.

Brother Piety lived in Indiana for about thirty years. He moved to South Bend in 1923, and finding no congregation already established, began conducting worship for his family in his living room. Person by person, family by family, the church began to grow. Now there are two sizeable congregations in South Bend, as well as neighbor ing congregations that were then non-existant.

During his life he was active in song directing and as a Bible teacher. He also served as one of the first elders the church in South Bend had.

During World War II, Brother Piety, along with another brother, helped to establish a congregation in Opopka, Florida, not far from Orlando, doing a great deal of the physical work in erecting the house of worship there.

A verse of comfort mentioned by a daughter seems to describe to a great extent the attitude of life that Brother Piety had. "Trust in Jehovah with all thy heart. And tean not upon thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge him, And he will direct thy paths." (Proverbs 3:5-6).
