

At a County Court held for Spencer County on Monday the 3rd day of February 1834
 This writing purporting to be the last Will and Testament of William Davis Deed
 was produced in Court by Jonathan Davis and William J Davis the Executors
 therein named and there being no subscribing Witnesses thereto Humphrey May
 John Eastburn James Tichenor and John Liley were sworn and severally deposed that
 they are well acquainted with the Testators hand writing, and verily believe the
 said writing and the name thereunto subscribed, to be wholly written by the tes-
 tators own hand whereupon the said writing is ordered to be recorded as the true
 last Will and Testament of the said William Davis Deceased and on the
 motion of Jonathan Davis and William J Davis the Executors therein named who
 made oath thereto and together with Vincent Davis Jonathan Davis Sen and Jephtha
 Berkley their Securities entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty
 of \$ 12,000 Conditioned as the law directs, certificate is granted them for obtain-
 ing a probat of the said will in due form Atteste Raphl. Lancaster C.S.C.
