are bidden and stand firmly bound and obliged unto *Frederick Malcast Esq.*
Judge of the Court of Probate for the District of Litchfield in the sum
of ~~one thousand~~ *one hundred* Dollars, to be
paid to the said Judge, or his certain attorney or Successor in said office: To the which
Payment, well and truly to be made and done, we the said *John Peck Jr*,
do bind ourselves and each of us, our heirs,
Executors and Administrators, and each and every of them, for, and in the Whole, firmly
by these Presents, signed with our Hands and sealed with our Seals. Dated at Litchfield
the 18th Day of June A.D. 1802.

THIS Condition of this Obligation is such, That if the above bounden *John Peck Jr*
all, and singular the Goods, Chattels, Credits and Estate of *John Peck late*
~~deceased~~ *John Peck* deceased, do make or cause to be
made, a true and perfect Inventory, of all and singular the Goods, Chattels, Credits,
and Estate of the said deceased which have or shall come to the Hands, Possession, or
Knowledge of the said *John Peck Jr*,
or into the Hands, or Possession of any other Person or Persons, for his, and
the same to make, do exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the Registry of the said Court
of Probate, in the District of *Litchfield*, after before the *18th Day of August*
next ensuing. And the same Goods, Chattels, Credits and Estate, and all other
the Goods, Chattels, Credits and Estate of the said deceased, at the time of his death,
which at any Time after shall come to the Hands or Possession of the said *John Peck Jr*,
be into the Hands or Possession of any other Person or Persons for him
do well and truly administer according to Law. And further, do make or cause to be
made a true and just Account of his said Administration, or before the *18th Day of*
October A.D. 1803 And all the rest and residue of said Goods, Chattels,
Credits and Estate which shall be found remaining upon the Administrator's Account:
the same being fully examined and allowed by the said Court of Probate, shall deliver and
pay unto such Person or Persons respectively, as the said Court of Probate, by their
Decree or Sentence, judgment to the one Intent and Meaning of the Law, shall limit and
appoint:--And it is further agreed upon that any last Will and Testament was made by
the said deceased, and the Recipient or Executrix therein named, do exhibit the same into
the said Court, making thereon to have it allowed and approved accordingly; if the said
being thereto proper, do render and deliver the said Letters of Administration (Ap-
proval of such Testament being well had and made) in the said Court, then this Obli-
gation to be void and of none effect; or else to remain in full Force and Virtue.
