KNOW YE, THAT I John Parker of Litchfield
the County of Litchfield and State of Connecticut

for the consideration of fifty five
Dollars, received to my full satisfaction of the heirs of Levi Park
late of said Litchfield deceased

do by these presents remise, release, and forever Quit-claim unto
the said heirs and to their

heirs and assigns forever, all such right, estate, title and demand
whatsoever, as I have or ought to have, in or to one hundred acres
of land lying in D Litchfield bounded as follows viz
On the North by Elizur Hollings land on the East
By Seth Farmer's land and on the Southward by my
own land containing Twenty two acres and one half
acres of land it being the same piece of land over
Divided by said Elizur Hollings to Levi Park

To have and to hold the above described premises unto ~~them~~ the
said ~~Heirs~~ ~~to them~~ only use and
behoof, and ~~their~~ heirs and assigns forever; so that neither I
the said John Parker nor my heirs, nor any
other person or persons for ~~me~~ or in ~~my~~ name and behoof,
shall or will hereafter claim or demand any right or title to the
premises, or any part thereof; but they, and every of them shall,
by these presents, be excluded and forever debarred.—In witness
whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 16 day
of Nov 1802
