KNOW YE, THAT I John Parker of Litchfield in the County of Litchfield and State of Connecticut

for the consideration of fifty five Dollars, received to my full satisfaction of the heirs of Levi Park of said Litchfield

do by these presents remise, release, and forever Quit-claim unto the said heirs and to their

heirs and assigns forever, all such right, estate, title and demand whatsoever, as I have or ought to have, in or to one certain piece

of land lying in Litchfield bounded as following viz On the North by Elmer Hobb Rip, Land on the East by the same Land and on the South and West by my own land containing Twenty two acres and one half acre of Land it being the same piece of land now owned by said Elmer Hobb Rip to Levi Park

To have and to hold the above described premises unto their heirs and assigns forever; so that neither I nor my heirs, nor any other person or persons for me or in my name and behoof, shall or will hereafter claim or demand any right or title to the premises, or any part thereof; but they, and every of them shall, by these presents, be excluded and forever debarred.—In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 16 day of Nov 1802
